
How to add images to ConnectDaily events

This is a "quick and dirty" method for how to add an image to a ConnectDaily event. The basic idea:


- use the Events Manager tools to add an image to a draft Event
- copy the code created there, and paste it into a ConnectDaily event.



In the Events Manager system (Events) create a dummy event.


You will not actually create an event, just use it to create image code.

Select "Add Media."




2 Use the standard tools to either upload a file or select an image already in the Media Library.

You may want to scroll down to view controls for exactly how the image displays




- Use this control to choose whether to display the image left, right or centered.
- 2 Use this control to choose whether to display the image full size, as a thumbnail, or at a couple other standard sizes.
- 3 Select "Insert into post" to close the selection window.


Select and copy the snippet of html code just created.




1 You may want to switch to Text to see the code, though you can also just select everything in the window on the Visual side.



Switch to ConnectDaily, and edit the event.




- Choose where you want the image to display in relation to the event text. Typical placements:
 - · Before the first text, with the image set to aligned right
 - After all the text, perhaps aligned center.
 - Between different blocks of text, aligned left right or center.




Paste the code snippet.

Save the event, and check to see if it displays as desired.



Some adjustments are possible directly in the code.



- 1 If you decide to change where the image displays you could replace "alignright" with "alignleft" or "aligncenter."
- You could also change the image size by adjusting width and height, but you'd want to adjust both, proportionately. It would usually be easier to go back to Events and start over, using the built-in tools there to change the image size.

When you are satisfied with how it all looks, back in Events you can delete or just navigate away from the dummy event.
