Individual contributors will be set up in the system and contacted to migrate billing information from inFellowship. • Fellowship 1 will be cancelled September 30th if Breeze Team is confident in new system (\$200 a month savings). • Caitlyn Vincent has taken over rentals management and is currently evaluating options for a new voicemail system and renegotiating our copier lease. • Charis Domador has designed an online inquiry form for potential rentals that will give them up-front pricing and reduce casual inquiries. These videos await completion of the Fireside Room. • Charis has begun formatting the Annual Report. Upon review, a few additional articles have been requested.
