# **Minutes – Draft**

## 1. Call to Order

A quorum being present (55+ in-person; 16 on Zoom) the meeting was called to order by Helen Tinsley-Jones, co-president, at 12:54 p.m. Pier Sun Ho and Helen Tinsley- Jones did the chalice lighting and reading, Pier Sun Ho read the Widening the Circle of Concern statement, Helen Tinsley-Jones read the covenant, and Selene Fabiano read the land acknowledgement.

## 2. Consent Agenda:

Adoption of Agenda

Approval of March 26, 2023, May 7, 2023 and May 21, 2023 Congregational Meeting Minutes

A Motion (M -Jean Gleason; S -Jane Lundin) to accept the consent agenda passed.

### 3. Staff Introductions and Appreciation

Rev. Marcus, Tess O'Riva, and Heaven Walker introduced the UUCB staff. Of the twenty-two staff members, 11 were present in person.

## 5. Committee Reports

<u>Stewardship Committee</u> – Lisa Maynard. Theme is "Wake now our vision." The kick-off for this year's stewardship campaign is on March 3<sup>rd</sup>. This year's goal is approximately \$450,000. Lisa encouraged those who can increase their pledge to do so. All pledges are greatly appreciated.

Endowment Capital Projects Oversight Committee - Presented by Tom Tripp

Resolutions in 2018, 2019, and 2021 authorized \$758,000 for capital projects. \$725,000 has been withdrawn thus far. \$840,000 work has been done thus far; \$660,916 came from the endowment funds and \$180,000 was from very generous targeted member donations. Of the money withdrawn, there is a balance of \$64,000. Subject to corpus, \$33,000 is available to be withdrawn.

Freestone Oversight Committee (FOC) - Presented by Co-Chairs Beth Pollard and Tom Tripp

A summary of what led to the formation of the FOC and its purpose was provided. The first milestone from the resolution is to raise \$250,000 by 12/1/24. The task of meeting these milestones falls to the Freestone Committee. One possible fundraising strategy is to get a conservation easement for the Freestone property. A conservation easement is a one-time payment from the federal government for commitment by a landowner not to develop that land. The Freestone Committee and the FOC recommended, and Board approved, to have Parcels 1 & 2 listed for sale as one possible way of meeting the \$250,000 for the 12/1/24 milestone. The listing of these parcels is happening along a parallel track as the conservation easement application.

The Fundraising Guidelines created by the FOC were shared. Tom Tripp announced that a vacation rental permit has been approved by Sonoma County; this permit allows short-term rentals for up to 60 days. Transient Occupancy Tax (a 12% tax) is charged when fees are charged for Freestone use. The Freestone Committee has requested that Freestone be opened up for daytime use. The FOC is looking into this request.

### 6. Call for General Assembly Delegates - Victoria Bowen

2024 GA will be virtual only and will be held June 20-23, 2024. GA is the annual meeting of the UUA. Thousands get together to worship, debate, and vote on policies. Seminars, workshops, opportunities to meet UU's from all over. Article 2 Commission will be the big topic this year and a final decision related to Article 2 will be voted on at this year's GA. UUCB can send 7 delegates. Delegates must attend the business meetings and grapple with the issues. UUCB members can apply to be a delegate. Victoria will help with assembling the delegate group this year. If you're interested in applying to be a delegate, let Victoria know. Pier Sun Ho and Helen Tinsley-Jones shared appreciation for the outgoing board members.

**9. Results of Board of Trustees Election** - Michael DeWitt, Beth Jerde, and Helen Toy were elected to the Board of Trustees. Lisa Maynard agreed to be the Treasurer.

### 10. Installation of Board of Trustees, Benediction, and Adjournment

Reverend Marcus installed the new board and gave the benediction. The meeting was adjourned at 2:25PM.
