How to Get There:

- From San Francisco, take Highway 101 north through Cloverdale.
- Take Highway 128 West, 55 miles to the coast.
- Take Highway 1 North to the town of Mendocino. At the first stoplight, turn right (East) onto Little Lake Road (County Road 408).
- Go 5 1/2 miles to the end of the pavement, where you'll see a sign indicating the way to the main gate to the Mendocino Woodlands.
- Take the dirt road to your right. Go 3 1/2 miles to the Caretaker's House.
- Pass Camp 1 on your right and continue passed Camp 3 to **Camp 2** at the end of the road.

NOTE: *Regrettably, this camp site may present accessibility issues to some persons with physical disabilities. If you have any questions regarding accessibility, please contact the camp deans.*

WHAT TO BRING:

- o Directions to camp – don't forget!
- o Clothes that layer
- o Sleeping bag and Pillow
- o Towels and Personal toiletries
- o Flashlights (Labeled) and Extra batteries
- o Battery powered lantern for cabin
- o Jackets, knit caps, sweatshirts
- o Mosquito repellent/sun screen
- o Hiking shoes, water bottles, day packs
- o Earplugs for light sleepers
- o Favorite Beverages
- o Games to share
- o Picnic chairs
- o Musical instruments, music & songbooks
- o Money: Woodlands Fundraiser, art supplies, etc.

DO NOT BRING:

- o Unregistered campers
- o Persons under 18

In registering for and attending Labor Day Camp, campers agree to abide by camp rules, which include, but are not limited to:
