She has continued to fight for decades against injustices. To this day, you will see Victoria in the crowds at detention centers, rallies for immigration rights and anti-racism and helping at GRIP.

In deciding to get more spiritual education, Victoria somehow found time to attend the Starr King School of Ministry and her ministerial skills are so evident in every activity she donates her time to. She participated on the Committee on Ministry for our emeritus ministers, Bill and Barbara. She brought our UU voice to the Chaplaincy program at Summit Hospital.

And at this very moment Victoria co-chairs Membership with me, is on the Leadership Team for Chalice Circles; has been a General Assembly Delegate more times that we can count; is on the Nominating Committee, the Program Council, and co-facilitates the "Widening of the Circle of Concern" Task Force.

But within Victoria's gentle soul is a very competitive ice skater and passionate teacher of skating. She is also a dancer who has choreographed and performed sacred dance at our church with dancer, Roger Dillahunty. In 2019 Victoria co- chaired with Melissa Rosales, the revival of liturgical dance at UUCB with the group, "UUCB Moves".

She is a mother, a sister, and a friend who can, just by a look, melt away anxiety and open you up to peace. I know. I've been so blessed to have her friendship and support.
