

Traditional Dancers






The Missionaries came with Spanish Soldiers




21 Missions/prisons built on stolen land


We were eight different nations


- With 8 different languages






And then we survived boarding schools and Indian Foster Care








We begin to remind people that we are still here

By "rematriation"

- ▶ I mean "to restore a living culture to its rightful place on Mother Earth," or "to restore a people to a spiritual way of life, in sacred relationship with their ancestral lands, without external interference." As a concept, rematriation acknowledges that our ancestors lived in spiritual relationship with our lands for thousands of years, and that we have a sacred duty to maintain that relationship for the benefit of our future generations.


